Fr Hugh writes:

Last Monday I attended the West Sussex Divisional Awards Ceremony hosted at Arundel Castle for the police, (not knowing that I too was to receive something myself!)

The reason for mentioning this, is that it was an opportunity to hear of the remarkable work that is done on our behalf in the county by our police of all ranks and ages. It is truly inspirational, and Lady Emma Barnard, our new Lord Lieutenant of the County who presented the awards reflected on their work. The area of Suicide prevention came to the fore, of officers gently rescuing people from bridges across key roads or in one case from the roof of St Richard's Hospital.

We have much to be grateful for, to those who put their lives at risk on our behalf. I am inspired; and will continue to offer chaplaincy support, which is much appreciated by Sussex and Surrey Police.

It is such a useful publication and having it delivered to your door is much easier that collecting it from the church. I prefer not to run a news agency!! A scaffold has now been erected at the back of the church again for some repairs, and hopefully to stop the water ingress around and below the stained glass window.

At the time of construction in 1973/74 many of the window glass are set straight into the concrete frames. Contemporary builders are not familiar with such construction, however sealants will be used as well as renewing the roof and flashing over the niche.

For the church entrance, the diocese finance team has requested that a project manager now be appointed to oversee the work. Inevitably it will raise the costs. There still is no start date for the work.

Autumn began on Thursday last officially, the Feast of St Matthew and this Friday we keep the Feast of the Archangels, Ss Michael, Gabriel and Raphael. (Michaelmas)

There is a selection of Michaelmas daisies in the garden, providing late September colour and perhaps stretching into October. They are such a useful and inexpensive way to add colour at this time of the year.

If you have surplus apples, please do bring them to share. In the fields the harvest is in, but of course for parts of our world, particularly Ukraine, crops have been destroyed by the continual fighting. In Africa, drought has prevented any food being grown at all. It is not surprising that so many people have become Migrants.

We hold them in Prayer on this special day of prayer for Migrants and refugees.
