# Fr Hugh Writes:

Thank you for your reflections on our statue of Our Lady. It is an important part of our church. We think that the way forward is to explore other ways of cleaning it up and perhaps repaint at some point. That is not at the top of the priority list!

This is 'Good Shepherd Sunday' the 4<sup>th</sup> of Easter. It is a day of prayer for Vocations, with a focus on Priesthood but not exclusively. There is a new leaflet for you to take home and have close to hand for our prayer time between now and Pentecost on May 19<sup>th</sup>. You will find various suggestions within the leaflet for these remaining weeks of Easter.

There is a retiring collection today for the education of future priests. Your purple gift aid envelopes maybe used.

Tuesday is the Solemnity of St George Patron of England. I think it may be preferable to celebrate the Mass here on Monday as far more of us come to that weekday Mass than on a Tuesday. I shall go to our Poor Clare Sisters on Tuesday to celebrate Mass with and for them.

Thursday is the feast of St Mark, Evangelist.

I'm taking a weeks holiday from 30<sup>th</sup> for a week with friends in Krakow, Poland, back in time for Ascension Day on Thursday 9th May.

Looking forward to celebrations here: we have Sinead and Theo's wedding on May 17th, followed by the Confirmations of Caithlyn and Grace on Pentecost Sunday. I'm also in conversation about Baptism celebrations in the summer.

Have you noted our summer party on June 30<sup>th</sup> in your diaries, to celebrate the Golden anniversary of our current church building? It will follow the same format as for last year's Coronation brunch in the hall or if it is a lovely early summer day in the garden.

Mass at 10am as usual for a Sunday, for the Solemnity of Sts Peter and Paul, and then a gentle move onward for our brunch together.

There is no charge, but you will need to book a place from 2nd of June, which is also the solemnity of Corpus Christi.

The soil has begun to dry out, probably more so for we few on the lower greensand in the parish, so it has enabled me to sow seeds of vegetables for a new season.

On a windowsill, brassicas are beginning to germinate. As one season closes, another begins.

Time to prune, those early flowering shrubs, such as forsythia and perhaps flowering currant. Remember to be bold, not just snip the ends but take out 1/3 of the oldest wood at ground level and so always renew with good vigorous growth, that will carry good flower in a year or two. Don't forget to feed your plants too!
