# Fr Hugh Writes:

This newsletter will cover two weeks taking us into January 2026, the next newsletter will be for Sunday 4th January.

As I write, the winter solstice is this Sunday, the 4th of Advent, Christmas follows and next Sunday will be the feast of the Holy Family. This is followed by the 2nd Sunday of Christmas on 4th January and the Epiphany on 6th, a Holy day of Obligation. Finally the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord is on January 11th.

These are the principal days and feasts of the Christmas season with many others in between. We have listed the days and times to be celebrated here in the season.

Mass on Christmas Eve will be celebrated as the Night Mass, whilst on Christmas morning it's the 'Dawn' Mass. Both gospel extracts are from St Luke with the familiar Christmas narrative.

The 4th Sunday of Advent Gospel centres on Joseph who as Matthew tells us, receives God's messages as if in a dream. This may help us to remember that it is in the silences in our lives that we are better placed to hear God's word in our lives.

This it seems to me is particularly important at Christmas in spite of all the bustle that surrounds the day and feast.

Whilst we listen to St Luke on Christmas day, we return to St Matthew for the feast of the Holy Family next Sunday, and the flight into Egypt. Hector Berlioz in his composition, 'L'Enfance du Christ' (the Childhood of Christ) depicts this so beautifully in music, perhaps the most celebrated part of the work is The Shepherds Farewell. Music can help us all meditate on these gospel passages. Finally on 2nd Sunday of Christmas, we read from the prologue to St John's Gospel.

A lot to take in, in a short time, yet the scripture passages do help us to understand how God became Man, to help us to be closely united through his son, to God. I look forward to sharing in these liturgies with you all once again.

The close of the year is always a time of giving thanks to: Mike looking after safeguarding, Jane-Health and Safety, Dan-Gift Aid, Sally & Andrew-Rotas, Claire-Music, Andreia-Children's Liturgy, Margaret-Newsletter, all the Welcomers and Barry with all the Altar Servers. Also our Deacons for their valuable work for so many and our thanks too, to the 'flower team' always providing us with fresh and interesting arrangements.
